Pancake Breakfast for HIKE

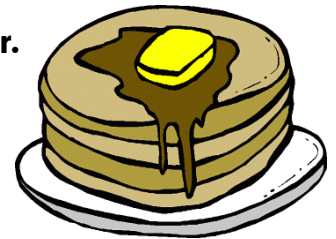

Operation Christmas Child

For my service project I will be filling shoeboxes to send to Operation Christmas Child (Samaritan's Purse). I am asking for anyone who would like to help make a child's Christmas a little bit better this year to help me by donating items to put in the shoeboxes. The boxes will be designated for either a boy or girls and the age range will be listed. They should be for age 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14. We do not know ahead of time what country the boxes will be sent to, but this year we can track where our box is sent. You can send a card or personal note inside your box and we can include a contact for return mail and we might hear back from whoever gets our box.

We will be having an early Christmas party at the Bethel on Nov. 19 to fill and wrap the boxes. They have a long way to go before Christmas and need to be sent by then. You can also help by donating money to help pay for postage. Each box costs \$7 to ship. There will be collection bins at the Lodge to put items in. If you have any shoeboxes, please bring those also.

These are some suggestions for what to bring: pens, pencils, crayons, markers, coloring book, paper, small books, small toy cars, yo-yos, jump ropes, slinky, small musical instruments, toothbrushes, toothpaste, comb, brush, hair things, bar soap in plastic bag, washcloth, socks, mittens, scarves, hats, sunglasses, watches, flashlights, play jewelry, small doll or stuffed animal, small ball, and other small toys, hard candy, or gum.



Do not include: used or broken things, war items like toy guns, knives or soldiers, chocolate, food, outdated candy, liquids, lotions, medicine, vitamins, aerosol cans, or breakable items.

Remember, we will pack and wrap the boxes on Nov. 19th.
